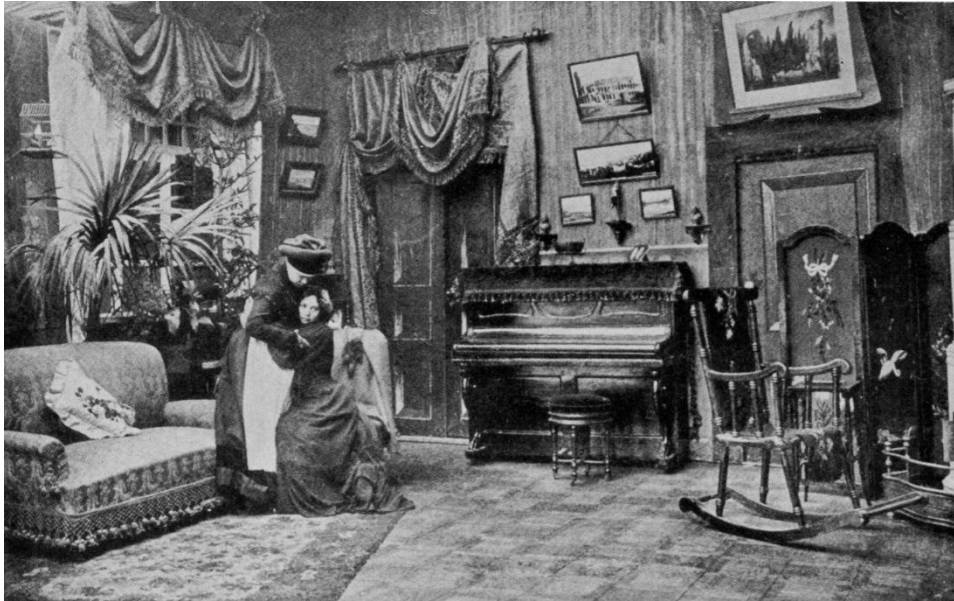

Statement:

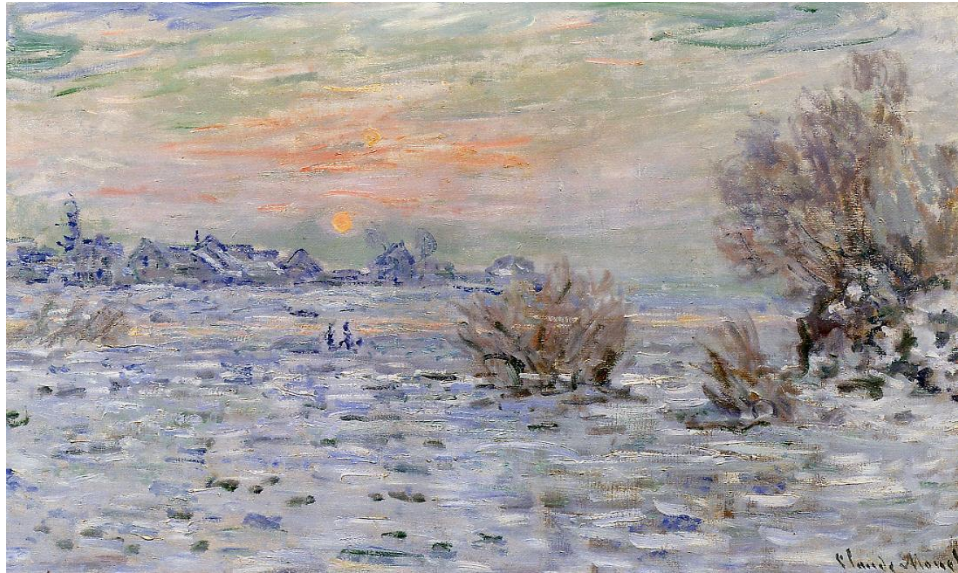

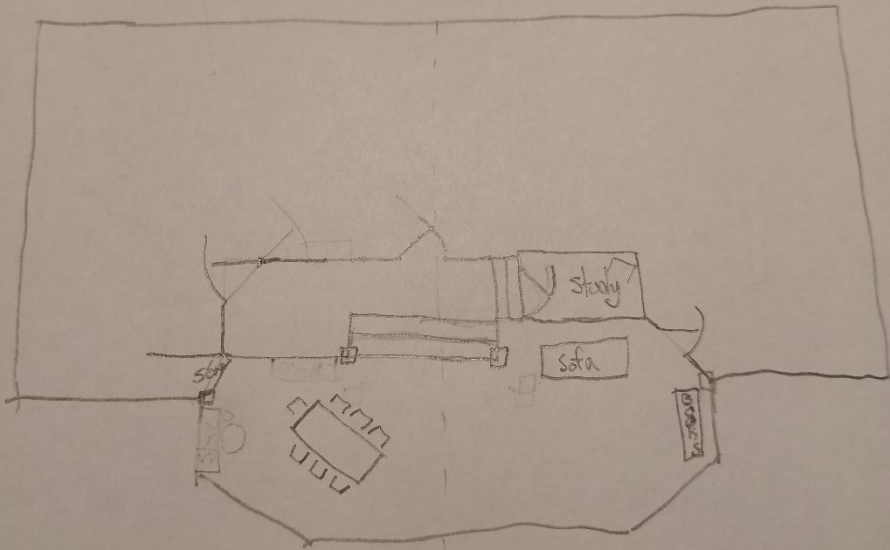
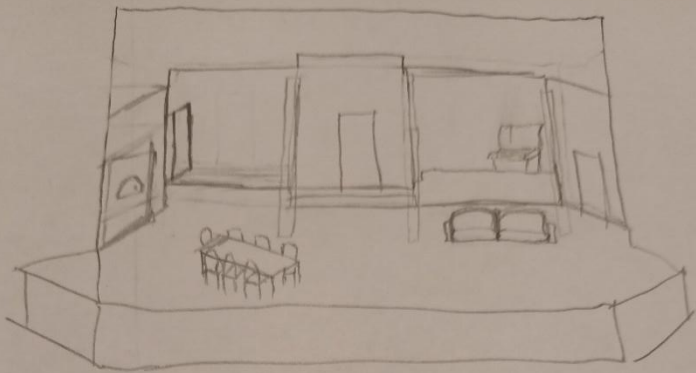












Gem of the Ocean
